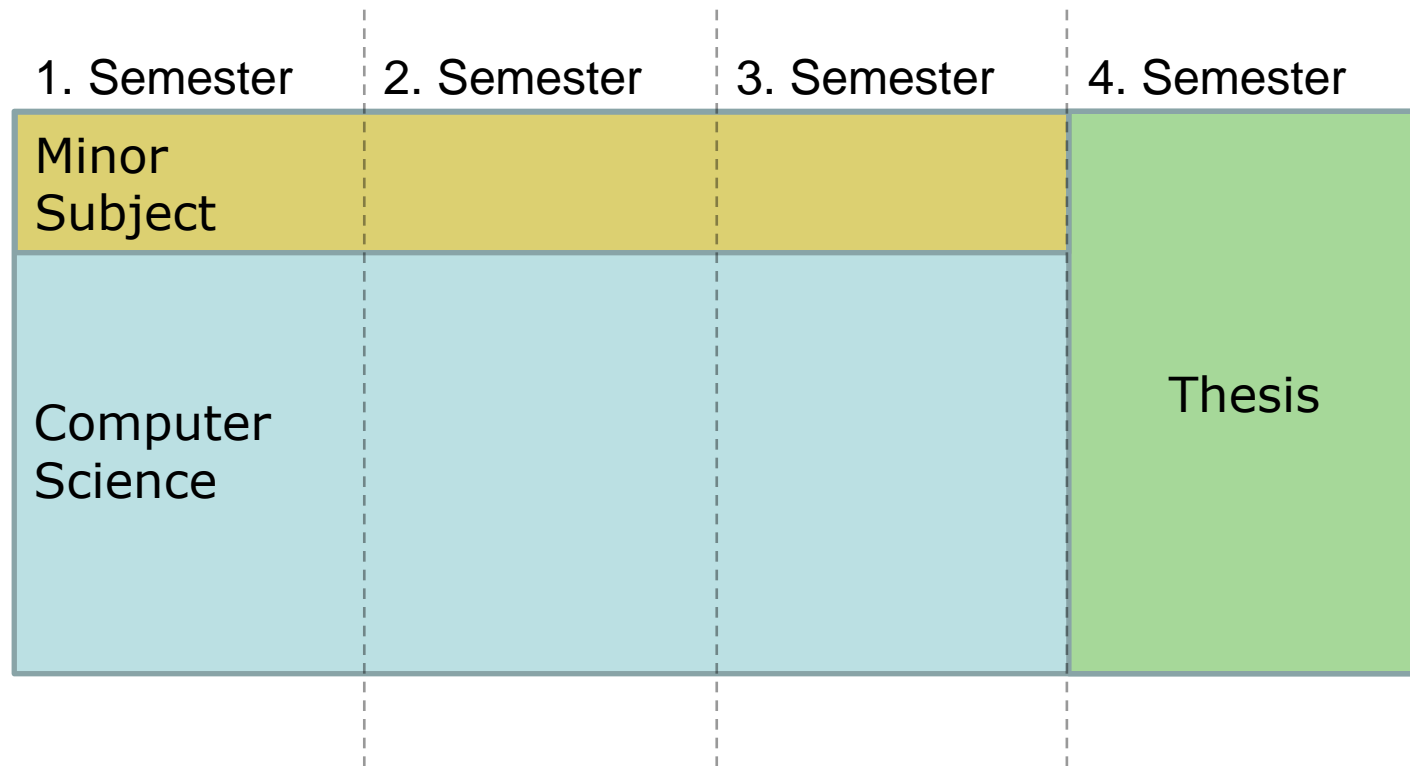

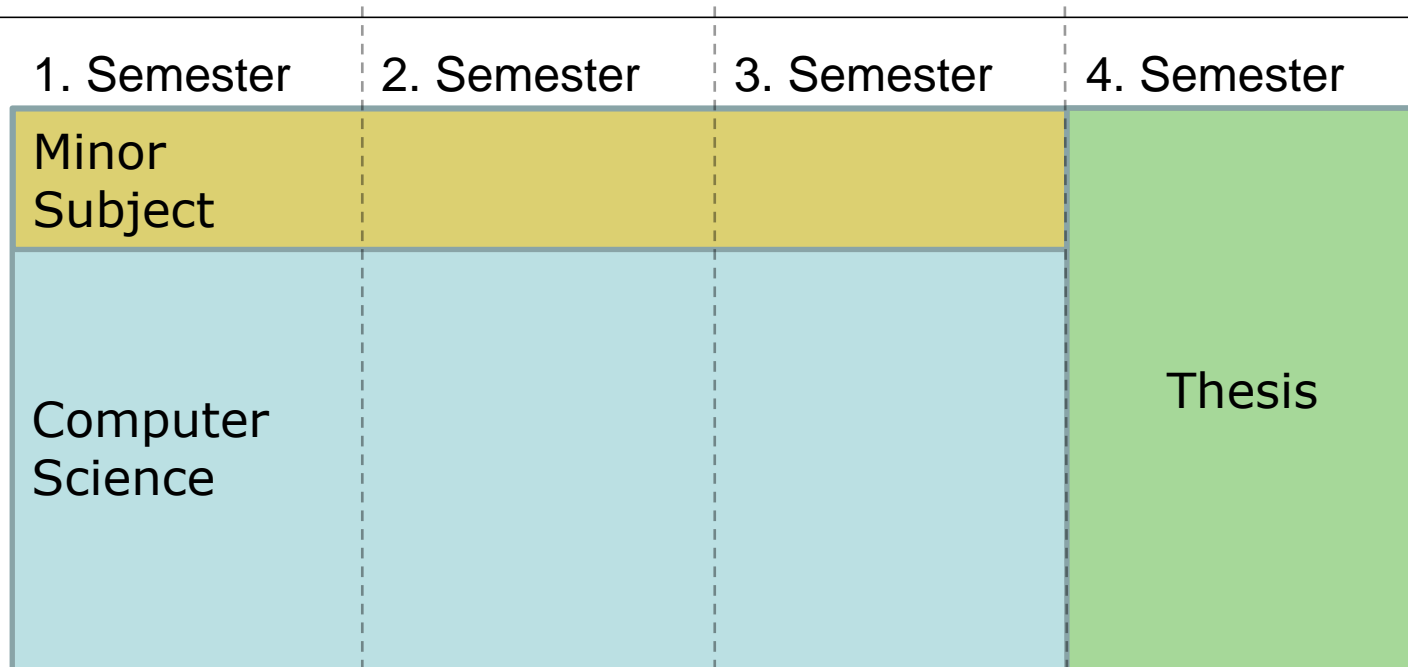

The M. Sc. Informatik

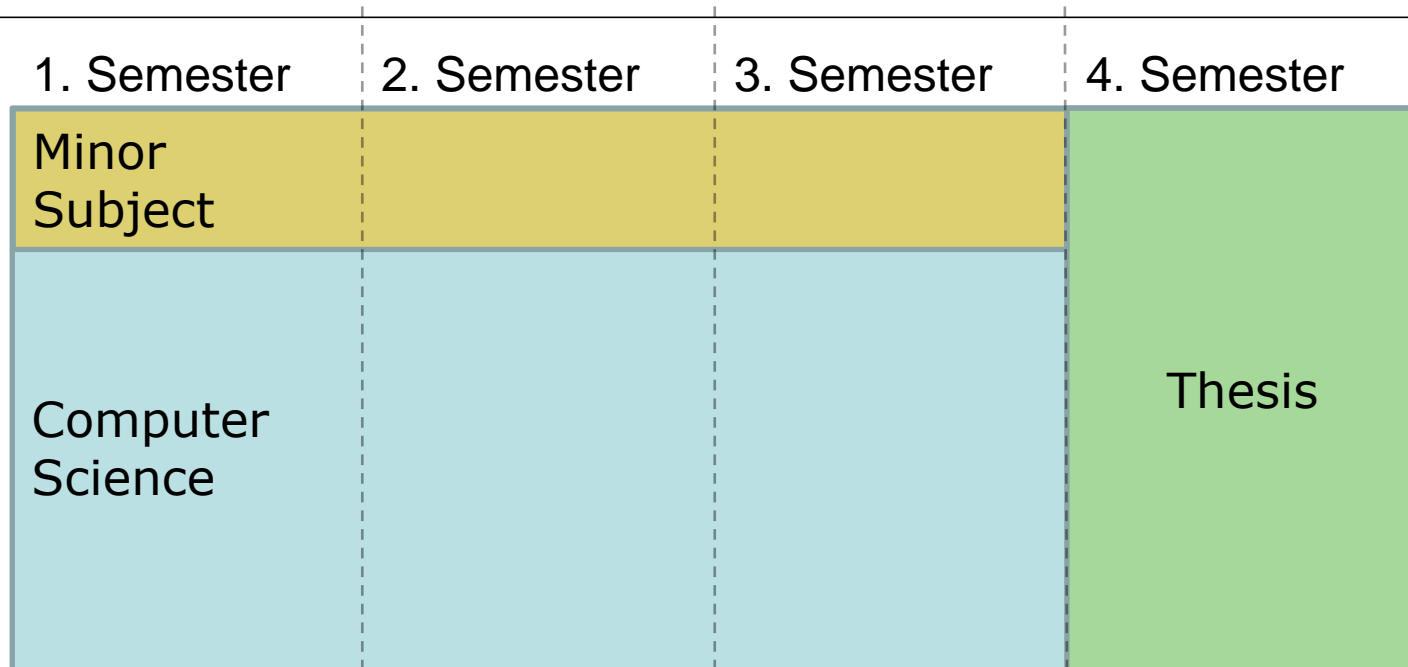


- The 66 Credits (CP) from computer science consist of
 - 45 - 54 CP through examinations ("**Fachprüfungen**") in lectures and exercises or integrated lectures from 3-4 of the given elective areas (min. 6 CP per area)
 - 12 - 21 CP by "**Studienleistungen**" (at least one seminar, at most one internship in teaching, at least one other form, a "**Studienarbeit**" does not count towards the last point)

The Six Elective Areas

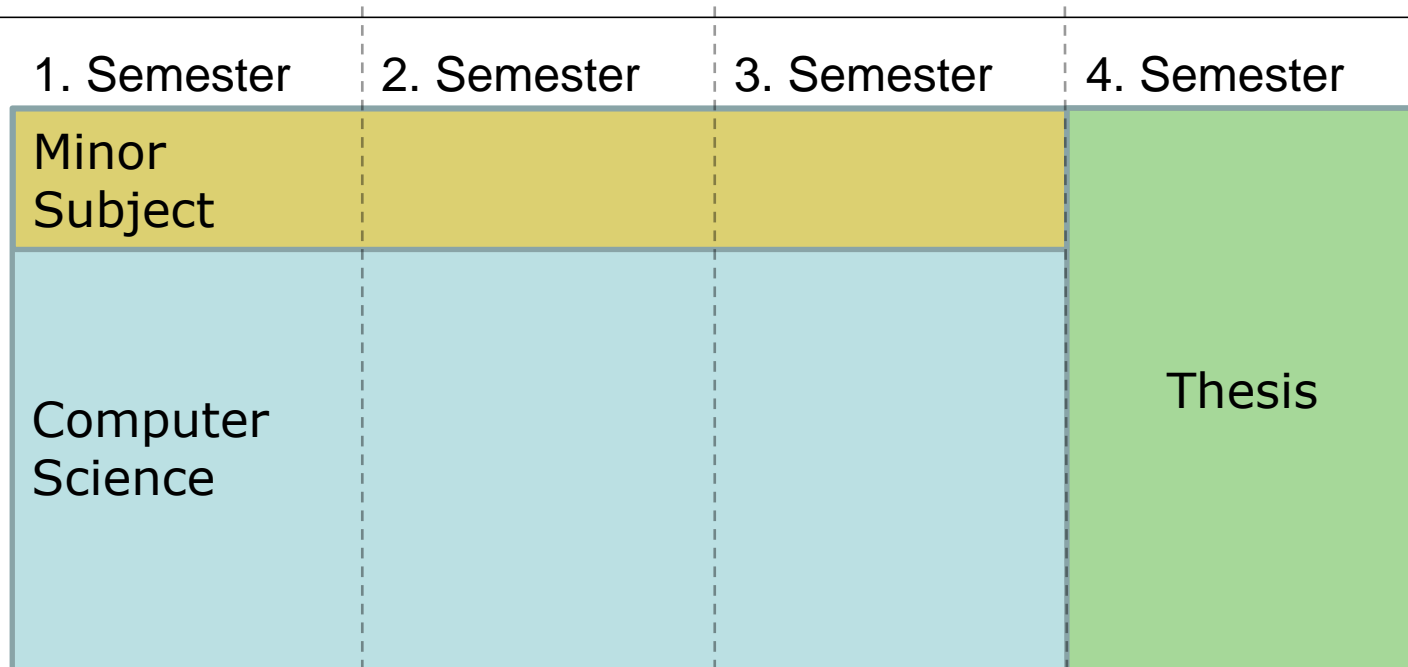
- IT Security
- Networks and Distributed Systems
- Robotics, Computational und Computer Engineering
- Software Systems and formal Basics
- Visual & Interactive Computing
- Web, Knowledge- and Information processing

The M. Sc. Informatik



- Master thesis rather towards the end
- Start with the minor subject as soon as possible

The M. Sc. Informatik



- You can study one or two semesters abroad
- Approximately one year lead time required

- At least 24 CP

Minor Subjects

- Advice on the content
 - Provided by the contact persons of the respective other department
 - Contact persons can be found (partly) in the curricula on the pages of the Department of Computer Science

Examination Related Topics

- For most Master's programs, there is no need to provide examination plans for electives
- Exception is the M. Sc. Autonome Systeme program
- Registration for modules/courses/examinations is done via TUCaN
- Important information about examinations can be found on the [website of the examination office](#) (**Studienbüro**)

Examination Related Topics

- Three attempts per „Fachprüfung“
- One supplementary oral exam ("**mündliche Ergänzungsprüfung**") (part of the third attempt)
- Registration required for all achievements during the registration period
- Withdrawal possible up to eight days before the exam (exception: inability to take the exam) ("**Prüfungsunfähigkeit**")
- Before all the necessary conditions for the graduation are fulfilled one "open" subject can be removed per area without giving reasons.
- A second time only for "good" reasons

Specialised Master's Programmes

- Examinations
 - No examination plan required for most degree programmes here either
 - Registration for modules/courses/examinations done via TUCaN.
 - Transfer of credits has to be requested via the examination office
- Student Advisory
 - For general (formal) questions, the students advisory service of the Department of Computer Science is responsible
 - The coordinators of the specialised Master's programme are responsible for advising on content

Specialised Master's Programmes

- Examination plans for M. Sc. Autonome Systeme
 - Submission of the examination plan BEFORE registration for the first examination
 - The coordinator must approve the plan.
 - Creation via the examination plan tool of the department
 - The registration itself is done via TUCaN

General Information - Multiple Studies



- Registration for a course only in one of the study programs
- Achievements can be transferred to the respective other study programs
- For transfer, the achievements must of course be selectable in the corresponding study programs.
- Transfer has to be requested via the examination office

General Information – Conditions

- As a rule, the conditions must be fulfilled within one year in a maximum of two attempts
- The imposed examinations should/must be registered through the examination office
- The conditions can be changed under specific circumstances

General Information - Part-Time Study



- Possible reasons are for example
 - employment, self-employment or freelance activity
 - Disability or chronic diseases
 - committee activity

General Information – Stay Abroad

- Stay abroad very positive for your own curriculum vitae
- In particular important for a scientific career
- Start language courses early
- Thesis or minor subject also possible
- Only one application period (November) per year for all possibilities
- Information event at the end of the summer semester

General Information – Stay Abroad

- You can apply again in May for places in the Erasmus+ area that have not been allocated
 - Only for one semester in the following summer semester
- For some study programs there is the possibility of a Double Degree
 - The application period is just around the corner and the planning is (somewhat) more intensive.
 - If you are interested you can come to one of the next foreign consultation hours
